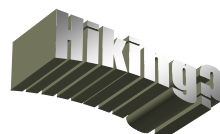

The entire troop family (including adults and older siblings) is invited to join this outing for fitness as well. **Meet on Saturday, May 1, 8:30am at Chabot Park in San Leandro.** Troop 726 check-in will be at the picnic table area on the left in a eucalyptus grove. Once everyone has checked in and orientation is completed, the hike will begin around 9am and be **finished about 2pm** after the last arriving hiker.

Directions from Castro Valley or Hayward (about 10min drive):

- Take I-580 West toward Oakland, and exit on Estudillo Ave in San Leandro;
- Follow exit under freeway, turn right at stop sign onto Grand Ave for 1 block;
- Next turn right at light onto Estudillo Ave, and go back under freeway;
- Go straight on uphill and bear left at first intersection with Lake Chabot Road (see sign for Chabot Regional Park);
- Continue by following Estudillo Ave down and around to the right over a narrow bridge into Chabot Park.

Each Boy Scout is invited to participate in this fun local event to raise money for his Scout account, which can be used to help fund many Scouting experiences (dues, outings, summer camp, National Jamboree, hiking/camping gear, etc) during the coming year.

To accomplish this, Scouts may choose to send out request letters to relatives, solicit friends to pledge donations, do an email campaign, OR just join our group for some fun in the sun walking 10 miles around the Lake Chabot loop trail. **Hike-a-thon fundraiser packets, including instructions, sponsor letters and a permission slip, will be distributed at the April 14th troop meeting.** (If you missed that meeting see Mrs. Schultz for a packet or permission slip)

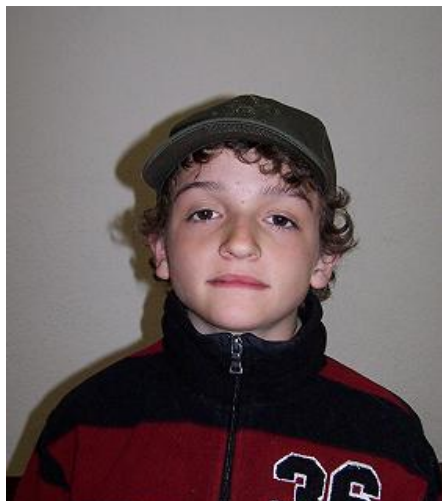

SFBAC TROOP 726 – SUMMER CAMP WEEK 2010

Troop 726 is going out of state for 2010 summer to Camp Makualla located in the state of Oregon, July 3 – 11, 2010!

The cost has been reduced to \$230 for current scouts and \$250 for new scout or incoming Webelos.

Camp Makualla has program opportunities for both younger Scouts and advanced Scouts. 37 merit badges including shooting sports, climbing, fishing, and sailing will be available. For advanced Scouts, the camp has a High Adventure Program which includes caving, whitewater, and climbing that will be done outside of camp. We will also be visiting Crater Lake.

We will be traveling by railroad to camp via Amtrak! **Departing Oakland's Jack London Square at 9:47 pm on Saturday night, July 3, 2010. Returning to Jack London Square at 8:35 am on Sunday morning, July 11, 2010.** Estimated cost for camp is \$230 (this is \$165 less than 2009) and includes; camp spending money, Amtrak rail transportation, troop equipment, leadership fees, and Crater Lake tour. **Does not include Merit Badge or additional High Adventure Program fees.**

5. If your HAT training is about to expire, please register for the upcoming HAT refresher course. Your training must be renewed every 5 years.
